Ivan's Message LATE AUGUST WARNING—SEPTEMBER ACTIVITIES—OCTOBER PEEK

COVID-19 UPDATE

Another disturbing and confusing month goes into the history books. Increasing daily new cases of CV-19 infection and selective closures of public facilities in some areas are the rule of the day in Illinois. I continue support and congratulate Governor Pritzker, his staff and the Public Health Departments of the state for their untiring work. I feel, as I'm sure they do, that it is endless.

Many of us are beginning to act stir crazy for good reason. Seven months under the conditions we have experienced is a long time even in the day of unbelievably rapid and often incomprehensible change. It's a wonderful thing that we have bonsai to help us through these conditions. When I work on trees, I get the feeling of calmness that I get nowhere else. That maybe we can make it through this dilemma until it reaches the inevitable end.

So, a plan of action: Keep following all the protocols

we have been instructed to perform. Even more strictly if you are at a higher risk. Maybe even cut back some of the activities allowed. I'm seriously considering paring down the circle of people I react with until conditions improve.

Possibly next month there will be happier news.

GARDEN UPDATE

At our board meeting Larry Stephan noted that he had been at the Chicago Botanic Garden and saw the Regenstein Center was being remodeled so not available for use until an unspecified date. Note the bonsai courtyards are open but you need to walk around the building to get from one to the other.

He asked if education center could be used for future general meetings and was waiting for response. He also inquired about the possibility of a tree sale and/or conducting small workshops in the fall. Shortly after the board meeting, he received an email stating that the

garden "...was cancelling the remainder of the onsite Plant Society meetings for 2020. We have also cancelled all remaining Flower Shows for the year as well. At this time the Garden still has not opened any buildings to the public aside from our Visitor Center and another set of restrooms. Later on in the year I will let you know the plan for 2021 meetings."

AUGUST

Hot, dry and windy through the end of the month. Keep the hoses handy. Maybe some afternoon watering in the picture.

No trimming for conifers. But, if Junipers persist in making that long, wispy growth—whack it off.
Deciduous and broadleafs
can be trimmed to keep
their shape.

Continue to prune tropicals. Even repot if needed. Watch for tightening wire on everything.

SEPTEMBER

We've lost about an hour and a half of daylight and the all trees know it. Many leaves are changing color and some are dropping off. So the gradual entering of the dormancy is beginning.

I always think of mid-September as the beginning of a short vacation from regular bonsai work and arbitrarily pick the fifteenth to begin the big changes. No more trimming of anything but tropicals. Continue to watch for tight wire as there is rapid wood growth taking place.

Change to a low Nitrogen fertilizer. 3-4% is about right. 1+0-20% range of Phosphorus and Potassium is good. Continue to fertilize until the trees are

put into winter storage. This will help the trees progress into dormancy with plenty of stored energy for new spring growth. This is also good for tropicals as it helps prepare them somewhat for the move indoors

Never use a fertilizer with no Nitrogen. The chemistry states that hardly any other elements will work without it. It is also known that Nitrogen is quickly depleted from containers that are constantly watered. That little bit of Nitrogen keeps everything in balance and the trees healthy. Without it most of the other elements build up and the medium can become toxic. Your bonsai are actually being starved.

Rain is forecast to be very sparse this month with daytime temperatures about normal, but night temperatures will be warm and retard the dormancy process somewhat. Some afternoon watering again will be needed on a few days. The warm nights will

allow the tropicals to stay outside all month.


Insects can be a big problem in September. They too know the winter is coming and are in a feeding frenzy. The warm nights will be very beneficial for continuing their feasts. Spider mites and mealy bugs are very active as are the chewers. The grasshoppers and katydids are full grown and can chomp down a whole lot in a day. Good insecticide with contact and systemic properties will do the job well. My favorite is Bayer's.

OCTOBER PEEK

Day temperatures will be about normal for the month averaging around 70 until the 24th—then cooler. Nights will be warm until the 23rd with a couple of dips below 50 on 10/14 and 19. The tropicals could stay out until 10/24. That's a drop-dead date. Cover them on the two cold nights. Or if you're gutsy just leave them alone.

All-in-all it's been a pretty good year for bonsai so far except for the next 4-5 weeks of dryness.
